IGHT hundred feet above the river and a few miles from Cold-Spring-on-Hudson is located this camp of 600 acres of forest and farm and hills, sur-

rounding a beautiful little lake.

An abundance of good food is served (prepared according to the dietary laws). Milk and vegetables are supplied by the camp farm.

All but the very young boys live in tents erected on frames with raised tight floors, making them dry and comfortable even during severe storms. Each camper has a spring cot with mattress, sheets, blankets and pillows.

Boating bathing and fishing are permitted only during designated hours and the lake is always under the supervision of experienced life guards. Boys unable to swim are taught without cost.

A large athletic field with regulation diamond, quarter mile running track and tennis courts is also provided.

Large social rooms make even stormy days delightful.

The camp is reached by the New York Central R. R. (a good train leaves Grand Central at 7:48 A. M., 125th Street at 8:00 A. M. round trip \$2.00) or Central Hudson Boats (on Sunday, boat leaves Franklin Street at 9:00 A. M. West 129th Street at 9:30 A. M., arriving at Cold Spring at 1:00 P. M. round trip 90 cents,

Candy, souvenir postals, baseballs, bats and smokers, supplies are sold at camp.

The rate for seniors (over 16 years of age), who are members of the organizations named on opposite page, is \$6.00 per week, for non-members \$8.00; juniors from 14 to 16 years of age, \$5.00 per week; juniors from 12 to 14 years of age \$4.00 per week.
